

CBIG-SCREEN is an EU-funded project that aims to reduce inequality by improving the offer of cervical cancer screening to vulnerable groups of women. Though cervical cancer screening programmes drastically reduce cervical cancer mortality, they remain largely inaccessible and underused by subpopulations of vulnerable women, exacerbating inequality.

Within CBIG-SCREEN, we will adapt established intervention models, for instance HPV self-sampling, to local context of three pilot countries (Estonia, Portugal, and Romania) to increase access to cervical cancer screening in subgroups of vulnerable women.

How can you contribute?
